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Representative Mannix Announces Amendments to House Bill 4002 Ahead of Joint Addiction and Community Safety Public Hearing

SALEM, OR – Today, Representative Kevin Mannix (R-Keizer/North Salem) introduced nine amendments to <u>House Bill 4002</u>, the legislation being considered by the Joint Addiction and Community Safety Committee, to address Measure 110. These amendments carry out his proposed plan that was <u>announced last week</u>.

"While I think that the enforcement mechanism presented by the Democrat majority is not as strong as it should be, it is a step in the right direction. We need to strengthen this with additional changes in the law, which is why I have proposed nine amendments to the package deal under consideration," **said Representative Mannix.**

The proposed amendments to House Bill 4002, include:

- <u>-12 Amendment</u>: Parents authorized to seek involuntary admission of any child under the age of 18 to treatment facilities for drug rehabilitation.
- <u>-15 Amendment</u>: Local government may enact local ordinances restricting public use of drugs which are unlawful under federal law.
- <u>-17 Amendment</u>: Create Office for Drug Prevention and Treatment to coordinate statewide programs and to evaluate use of the Dome Building (former Oregon State Hospital facility) as a residential treatment facility.
- <u>-18 Amendment</u>: OSU Extension Services Project to accelerate the promotion of behavioral health in rural areas.
- <u>-19 Amendment</u>: State Police to study ways to expedite drug testing for criminal cases.
- <u>-20 Amendment</u>: Drug traffickers held in custody until arraignment; bail required between arraignment and trial. State shall reimburse county for cost of pretrial incarceration of persons charged with drug trafficking.
- <u>-34 Amendment</u>: Department of Corrections shall establish regional residential treatment facilities capable of accommodating persons where there is no local treatment facility available.

- <u>-35 Amendment</u>: A person with a substance use disorder may be committed and receive treatment as to a substance use disorder.
- <u>-36 Amendment</u>: New hospitals providing substance use disorder treatment not subject to the certificate of need process.

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
